
Have You Noticed the Cannas?

Your civic association hopes that everyone has noticed the tall green plants growing around the lampposts in our neighborhood over the last three summers. These are canna bulbs and halfway into summer you should also see red flowers adorning the top of each plant.

Cannas definitely fall into the low-care category during the summer. They need little water, thrive in direct sun and grow with or without extra fertilizer. Last May volunteers planted over two hundred bulbs in the Maize-Morse area.

Fortunately each bulb self-reproduces several times throughout the growing season. This means that when we dig each plant up in the fall there are four times as many bulbs compared to what we started with. In the fall, bulbs that did not reproduce well are left in the ground to become fertilizer for next year's planting.

This year we will have enough bulbs to plant cannas next to every lamppost in the neighborhood. If you are motivated to help with this endeavor we will be planting again on Monday, May 13 at 6:30 p.m. We will meet at 920 Marland Drive South to pick up the bulbs and get locations for this year's planting of the cannas.



Spring Planting Guide

Here is a planting guide for seeds and plants

Beans, bush or snap, seed: May 15 to June 1
(succession planting in mid-June will produce a second crop)

Beans, pole, seed: May 15 to June 1

Broccoli, plant: April 1-15

Cabbage (early), plant: April 1 to May 15

Carrot, seed: April 1-10 (can sow every two weeks into late June for continuous harvest)

Chard, Swiss, seed: April 15-25 (can sow every two weeks into July for continuous harvest)

Collard, seed: April 1-10; often sown in mid-July for a fall crop as best flavor develops with frost

Corn, seed: May 1 to July 1, depending on early, mid- and late-season varieties

Cucumber, seed: May 15 to June 1

Lettuce, seed: April 1-10

Lima beans, seed: May 20 to June 1

Okra, seed: May 15 to June 1

Onion, plant: May 1-10

Onion, green, sets: April 1-10

Pea, seed: April 1-10

Pepper, plant: May 15 to June 1

Potato, seed pieces: April 1-10

Radish, seed: April 1-10 (can sow every seven to 10 days into early May for continuous harvest into early summer)

Spinach, seed: April 1-10

Squash, summer, seed: May 20 to June 1

Squash, winter, seed: May 20 to June 1

Sweet potato, slips: May 15 to June 1

Tomato, plant: May 15 to June 1

Watermelon, seed/plant: May 20 to June 1


